STRATEGIES FOR PROMOTION IN CLASSES VI TO VIII

1. Minimum 75% attendance is must for appearing in final examination.
2. Absence on working days will not be permissible without documentary evidence in advance.
3. For getting promotion to next class, one has to score minimum 33% in individual subject and in aggregate in the overall examination.
4. A student, who fails in one or more than one subjects, is entitled for Re- Examination in the particular subject/subjects. Promotion to next class will be strictly as per CBSE rules.
5. The promotion to next class will be subject to the condition that a minimum of 25% of marks be scored in each subject in annual examination.
6. A student in the class VIII, if he/she does not clear Re-Examination as per CBSE rules, will be placed in the category of "Essential Repeater".

STRATEGIES FOR PROMOTION IN CLASSES IX TO XII

1. Minimum 75% attendance is must for appearing in final examination getting promoted to next class as per CBSE bye laws.
2. Absence on working days will not be permissible without documentary evidence in advance.
3. Change of subject in class XI after August will not be permitted.
4. For getting promotion to next class, one has to score minimum 33% in individual subject and in aggregate in the overall examination in theory and practical separately.
5. A student having six subjects in class XI and fails in any one subject (other than language) can continue in class XII, subject to leaving the subject in which he/she has failed.
6. A student of class XI, who fails in any one subject out of five subjects studied or in two out of six subjects studied will be entitled for compartment exam in the subject/subjects he/she has failed. Promotion to next class will be strictly as per CBSE rules
7. A student of class IX & X, who fails in any one/two subjects out of five subjects studied, will be entitled for compartment.
8. All teachers who are teaching in IX to XII are having their stay back in the school once in a week. Students can stay in the school during that time (2.30 p.m. to 3.30 p.m.) to clear their doubts.
9. Saturdays other than second & last Saturday will be working for all students.
